

Lyle Iverson

Lyle K. Iverson, 74, of 401 N. Auburn Ave., died at 12:08 a.m. Aug. 7, 1999, at St. Joseph's Hospital where he was admitted the previous day.

Funeral services will be at 11 a.m. Wednesday at Faith Lutheran Church with the Rev. Gary A. Hedding, pastor, officiating.



Kathy Biederwolf will be the organist and vocalists will be family and friends. Military rites will be conducted at the church by the American Legion Post 54 of Marshfield.

Burial will be in Fort Snelling National Cemetery in Minneapolis. Pallbearers will be his grandsons, Eric, Troy and Christopher Iverson, Matthew, Mark and Kevin Anderle, and Nicholas and Robert Johnson.

Visitation will be from 5 to 8 p.m. Tuesday at Rembs/Kundinger Chapel and again from 10 a.m. until service time Wednesday at the church. A Fraternal Order of Eagles Badger Aerie 624 memorial service will be held at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday at the funeral chapel.

Mr. Iverson was born Nov. 6, 1924, in Parshall, N.D., to Alfred O. and Milla (nee Kringle) Iverson. He married Nettie C. Monson on June 15, 1949, in Parshall.

He attended elementary school in Parshall and graduated from Parshall High School in 1942. He then attended the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks for one year before serving in the United States Army from 1943 to 1946 during the European Theatre. After his honorable discharge from the Army, he returned to studies at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minn., where he received a bachelor of music degree in 1950. He then received his master's degree from the University of Indiana in Bloomington in 1962. His first teaching position was in Terry, Mont. for two years, then to Fairbault, Minn., for one year. He taught in Waseca, Minn., for seven years, Ripon for five years, and then the University of Wisconsin Center in Marinette for four years. While at Marinette he was the co-founder of the Theater On The Bay and had been a member of St. Olaf's choir for four years. He moved to Marshfield in the fall of 1970. Lyle was the choir director at Marshfield Senior High School from 1970 through 1988 when he retired after 18 years. During this time his choirs toured Europe, and the United States including Washington, D.C. Following his retirement, the Iversons continued to reside in Marshfield. Lyle was the rehearsal director of the Palm Sunday Concert.

He was a member of the Wisconsin Music Educators, the Barber Shoppers, Faith Lutheran Church and the church's choir director; American Legion Post 54 of Marshfield; the Fraternal Order of Eagles Badger Aerie 624 of Marshfield and a former member of the Marshfield Elks Lodge 665.

Surviving are his wife, Nettie Iverson; three daughters and two sons, Karen (Mark) Anderle of Roseville, Minn. Larry (Sue) Iverson of Minocqua, Nancy (Charles) Johnson of Burnsville, Minn. Mark (Charla) Iverson of Colorado Springs, Colo., and Kirsten Iverson of St. Paul Minn. He is further survived by 13 grandchildren and his sister Ardyce (Ernest) Park of Columbus, Ohio.

He was predeceased by his parents.

Memorials may be given in Lyle's name for a scholarship fund which will be established at a later date.
