



Stewart (Stu) William Peterson was born on a farm near Blooming Prairie, MN on October 7, 1923 to Charley J. and Mary Caroline (Dutton) Peterson.

Stu attended District 45 grade school, country school and graduated from Blooming Prairie

High School in 1941. After graduation he worked on the family farm while older brothers were fighting WWII.
